(Parents, please assist your child in choosing a novel that is appropriate for their interest and reading comfort. The book should feel "just right"...not too challenging but not too easy (2))

-at least 3 <u>strong</u>, convincing pieces of evidence supporting your reasoning (note: reasons like "It was fun," or "It was cool" are not acceptable)
-transition words
-a concluding sentence
